Dear Parents and Community Members:

The Little Falls Township School District as required by law, maintains an Integrated Pest Management Plan (IPM).

The IPM Coordinator for the Little Falls Township Schools is Mr. Thomas Bisignano, Supervisor of Building and Grounds, who can be reached by calling the Little Falls Board of Education at 973-256-7371, which is located at Little Falls School # 3, 560 Main Street, Little Falls, New Jersey during regular business hours throughout the year.

The following pesticides were used during the past twelve months throughout the school district:

- Gourmet Ant Bail – Low Impact Ant Ghel Used In Buildings For Ant Control

Interested individuals may contact the IPM Coordinator if they are interested in reviewing the product label and material safety data sheet (MSDS), when available, of each pesticide used on school property. In addition, Mr. Bisignano is available to meet and/or talk with parents, guardians, and staff members should questions arise. At this time, the Little Falls Board of Education has approved the IPM Plan, and is not contemplating any changes in the plan.

As part of the school pest management plan the Little Falls School District, may use pesticides to control pests. The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) registers pesticides to determine that the use of a pesticide in accordance with instructions printed on the label does not pose an unreasonable risk to human health and the environment. Nevertheless the EPA and the DEP cannot guarantee that registered pesticides do not pose any risk to human health thus unnecessary exposure to pesticides should be avoided. The EPA has issued the statement that when possible persons who are potentially sensitive such as pregnant women infants and children should avoid unnecessary pesticide exposure. It has been the practice of the district to make every effort to use pesticides when staff and students are not on school grounds, or on the weekends to limit any potential issues.
